### Pastor's Column • October 2

The setting for today's reading from the Book of the Prophet Habakkuk is Jerusalem as it is besieged by the Babylonians in 600 BC. He tries to console his fellow citizens by encouraging them to have faith in God because they will not be disappointed. The Lord responds to their cry, not by addressing the question put to Him, but by a solemn declaration of faithfulness to the covenant, confirmed in writing. There is nothing more than a simple declaration: the Word of God accomplishes what it says, the vow written by God already begins to be fulfilled. There is no room for impatience, and even less for doubt: "the vision still has its time," the fulfillment will surely come; to wait for it in hope is to prepare oneself to receive it; the just will live "because of faith," solidly based on God's own faithfulness. The words of the prophet give us hope in our present situation no matter how painful or distressing it might be that God is always faithful and we can always rely on Him.

In our passage from Saint Paul's second Letter to Timothy. Paul, who is in jail, encourages Timothy in the face of the persecutions that are coming. He reminds Timothy of the gift of the Holy Spirit he has received through the "imposition of hands" at his ordination. It is through this action that Timothy has received the gift of the Holy Spirit and his mission to lead the community. He is to preach the good news with confidence and bear his "share of hardship for the gospel with the strength that comes from God." The words of Paul encourage us to "stir into flame" the gift of grace we have received from the Holy Spirit beginning with Baptism and Confirmation. Many times we can feel overwhelmed by the experiences and circumstances of our lives but we must never forget that the Lord has given us the gift of the Holy Spirit. The Spirit leads and guides us with courage and strength in the most difficult of times realizing that we are never alone—God is always with us.

In our passage from Luke's gospel, the apostles ask Jesus to, "Increase our faith." Jesus responds by proclaiming the extraordinary power of faith. He expresses it in a way that is striking because of its powerful imagery of the seed and the mulberry tree. The illustration of faith and the mustard seed used by Jesus becomes a teaching moment for the apostles to remember that in every situation, whatever trials, difficulties, and hardships one must remember that nothing is impossible with faith. Jesus illustrates "our duty" as His servants by his second story. The faithfulness of the servant, which will have its reward, is a grace given at the initiative of one who calls, brings about a response, and enables one to endure to the very end. Consequently, one has nothing to boast of before God. One has no right to claim a wage, "We have only done our duty" through the grace of the Lord. The extraordinary power of faith—a faith we ask God to increase—which allows us, weak and mortal though we are, to accomplish marvelous things: for God, nothing is impossible! The joy of the believer called to the service of God performed faithfully and in a totally unselfish manner through love. The servant of God claims nothing for himself, not only because he has received all that he has from God but in imitation of his Lord and Master who came not to be served but to serve.

# St. Therese of the Child Jesus, the Little Flower, Doctor of the Church, Feast: October 1.

Celebrations for the August canonization of St. Teresa of Calcutta included a holy card portraying her with three Carmelite saints who share her name, St. Teresa of Avila, St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, and St. Therese of Lisieux. Each of the four was an impressive woman and each underwent extraordinary suffering. The Little Flower's autobiography, *Story of a Soul*, is immensely powerful and illuminates her 'little way', doing the ordinary things of life with extraordinary love. 'Everything is grace' she wrote.

# Accidental Theologians, by Elizabeth A. Dreyer (282.09 D825 A21).

A contemporary theologian describes the 'history-changing' effect of four women (all with the title 'Doctor of the Church') in the world. None of these women 'fits neatly into what we normally think of as theology,' Dreyer writes.

# Love in the Heart of the Church: The Mission of Therese of Lisieux, by Christopher O'Donnell (B T327 O265 L682).

This book shows Therese's contribution to today's evangelization, specifically her 'self-identity as "love in the heart of the Church." The saint's understanding of charity, vocation, suffering, martyrdom, and many other aspects of faith are a witness and encouragement to today's Catholics. The conclusion of the book quotes her profoundly moving thoughts on the communion of saints.

### Therese, by Dorothy Day (B 327 D19 T327).

This author's short biography of Therese is a personal memoir based on many years' thought. It differs from the titles mentioned above by describing the saint's development from childhood to maturity.

### CHIMES CHATTER

What does a company's logo embody? How does a logo evoke a statement? Our bell tower chimes were manufactured by Chicago's John C. Deagan Company, founded in 1880, and perhaps epitomized marketing strategies associated with successful logos. The word "logos" is of Greek origin and conventionally means "word" or "thought". Logos are recognizable and unique graphic designs a company uses for product recognition. Several distinct "Deagan" logos are



stamped prominently at key locations throughout our chimes system. On the patent plate of the automatic chiming device in the Work Sacristy, the logo is simply the word "Deagan" with the two "A's" in upper case, notably larger font and all letters connected with underscore. Perhaps the significance of the two prominent A's suggests a "double A-rating" for quality.

Who Knew?: One of Deagan's earliest logos was a monkey ringing musical bells. Deagan, a master clarinetist, incorporated his business in 1913 as J. C. Deagan Musical Bells, Inc. associating his products with the musical monkey icon. Why a monkey? Perhaps inspiration came from Deagan's extensive southeastern Asia travels, encountering unusual musical instruments, while many revered local monkeys frolicked about. Three years later during World War I, the name was changed to J. C. Deagan, Inc., and the logo emblem became simply "Deagan" with the word "Quality" imbedded within the Deagan letters in smaller font. The Deagan name quickly became synonymous with premiere quality products.

### OUTREACH

Shrine of the Most Blessed Sacrament Outreach Commission Beginning in October, the Shrine of the Most Blessed Sacrament Outreach Commission will adopt a thematic approach to focus Blessed Sacrament's outreach efforts, selecting a new theme every two months. For October and November, the commission will highlight homelessness in the District. A census this year identified nearly 8,400 persons as homeless and an increase of about 32% in homeless families (T.C.P.P.H., 2016).
