PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Parish Family:

A few days ago, we accepted the ashes of repentance and made Lenten resolutions to pray, fast, and give alms to the poor. Anyone who enters a desert, however, does not really know what to expect. At the beginning of a retreat, one is frequently asked to consider the particular grace that is needed or desired at that time. Although our prayers and penances are usually done in private, as the gospel for Ash Wednesday suggested, we do need the support of one another on our spiritual journey. The ashes we wore expressed the truth that we are all sinners and are all engaged in the on-going process of conversion. Like the dirty windshield of our cars on a bright sunny morning in the winter, in the light of God's grace we become more profoundly aware of our sinfulness and distance from God. As is true on most retreats, once we have entered the desert we are often confronted by the "wild beasts" of our temptations. Fundamentally, the evil one wants us to "give up" and yield to fear and despair. The challenge of Lent is to trust in God's compassionate mercy and to prepare once again to profess our faith at Easter. Do you know when the devil returned to tempt Jesus one final time?

Parish Projects:

Church Roof – About 20% of the tower work is complete and most of the lower level areas around the church are complete. While progressing well, the completion time will be a function of the weather. The additional levels of scaffolding being installed due to the size of the cross on top are still in progress and will coincide with the refurbishment of the cross. The construction areas and grounds around the fencing remain off limits to pedestrians for

safety reasons. Sidewalk areas may be temporarily blocked periodically for safety reasons, but all church entrances should remain open. Also, for safety reasons, all work areas, especially inside the fencing, is off limits to everyone except contractors.

This upcoming tax return season, Catholic Charities is managing an IRS Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) Program at Catholic University's Columbus School of Law.

CPAs and tax lawyers are needed to provide pro bono tax preparation for the working poor. If a return is filed, many of these workers will enjoy a sizeable IRS refund check due in large part to the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC). The EITC can help lift thousands of Washington area families out of poverty and keeps them out of poverty. Sadly, almost 20,000 low income residents of DC are not claiming the EITC, and thus are losing a potential financial resource for them.

We will be providing training in January for all interested volunteers. Tax return preparation will take place on Saturdays from February 3 to April 14.
