PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Parish Family & Visitors:

As the women made their way to the tomb of Jesus early in the morning, a question was swirling around in their minds: "Who would roll back the heavy stone that sealed the grave?" I grew up with the tradition of visiting cemeteries with my parents. The stones that marked the graves of relatives I had never met filled me with questions about the lives they lived. Conversations with my parents and research have provided me with some insight; but one truth will forever evade me until we meet on the other side. What was the very large stone that challenged their faith? We have met various barriers to our faith in the goodness and love of God; but we have yet one more hurdle through which to pass - the valley of the shadow of death! Even here, however, the psalmist tells us "we shall fear no evil." The joy of the resurrection is the simple discovery of the women that the "stone had already been rolled back." The victory is won for us!

The great sign of this victory is contained in a ritual we perform here many times just about every weekend of the year – baptism. The infant model, however, is derived from a much more powerful adult act of conversion. St. Basil described it in this way:

"We imitate Christ's death by being buried with him in baptism...it means first of all making a complete break with our former way of life." (Office of Readings – Tuesday of Holy Week)

There must be a stripping, an anointing, a renunciation, a profession of faith, a plunging into cool flowing water, and an anointing with perfumed oil. We are not our own! We are Christ's! Our robes are white after having been washed in the blood of the lamb! Perhaps you know the story of the ewe who had lost her lamb and the lamb who had lost a mother? The mourning ewe would not accept the orphan lamb unless and until it had had the blood of the ewe's dead lamb rubbed all over it! We are the "adopted" children of the Father who recognizes the blood of the Son made present in us through the power and love of the Spirit! As ones who have some sense of this love and the victory that has been won, we have an obligation to share the joy: "After all, you have died; your life is hidden now with Christ in God!" (Colossians 3:3) Our greeting today and for the next fifty days is to be:

Christ is Risen Alleluia! He is Risen indeed, alleluia, alleluia!

Each year, Blessed Sacrament School collects money for the Leukemia Lymphoma Society. This annual drive is called Pennies for Patients and raises funds for blood cancer patients. Before students are given boxes to collect money, a representative of the Society comes in to teach everyone about blood diseases and how to treat them. We learn about white blood cells, cancer cells, and chemotherapy. Each class raises their collection of money-and not just pennies. So, many different people know that Pennies for Patients is putting money put towards a just cause; we raise money to help improve cancer research and save lives. The class with the most money wins a pizza party! Our collection has just ended, and some classes raised 200 dollars or more!

Not only is Pennies for Patients ringing in our minds, but our superhero-themed auction sold over 500 items! These included a house blessing by one of the priests, a new bike, and baskets from each class. This fun-filled night transforms the gym as the parents bid for items from a real auctioneer. Bidders out bid each other for baskets, and all of the other items. Hero food was on the menu, and decorated tables filled the room for the occasion. The Blessed Sacrament auction gets better each year in many ways. Even the kids are excited to hear what their parents won and participate in the week before the event by dressing in pajamas or jerseys and other costumes during the Spirit Week lead up. The Blessed Sacrament auction is a night with joy as friendships form.

Dear Parishioners,

The Season of Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving is upon us! This Lent, I want to invite you to direct a portion of your sacrifice towards the house of prayer we call the church building. Some months ago, we asked your assistance with the necessary repairs to the tower and the roof. Thirty households responded very generously; but we still need \$183,000! If half of the 3,400 registered households gave \$125, we would have more than enough to pay for the project. The attached photos of the damage to the wood underneath the slate portrays clearly the desperate need. I assure you that I, too, am participating in this special drive and thank you in advance for your kindness!
